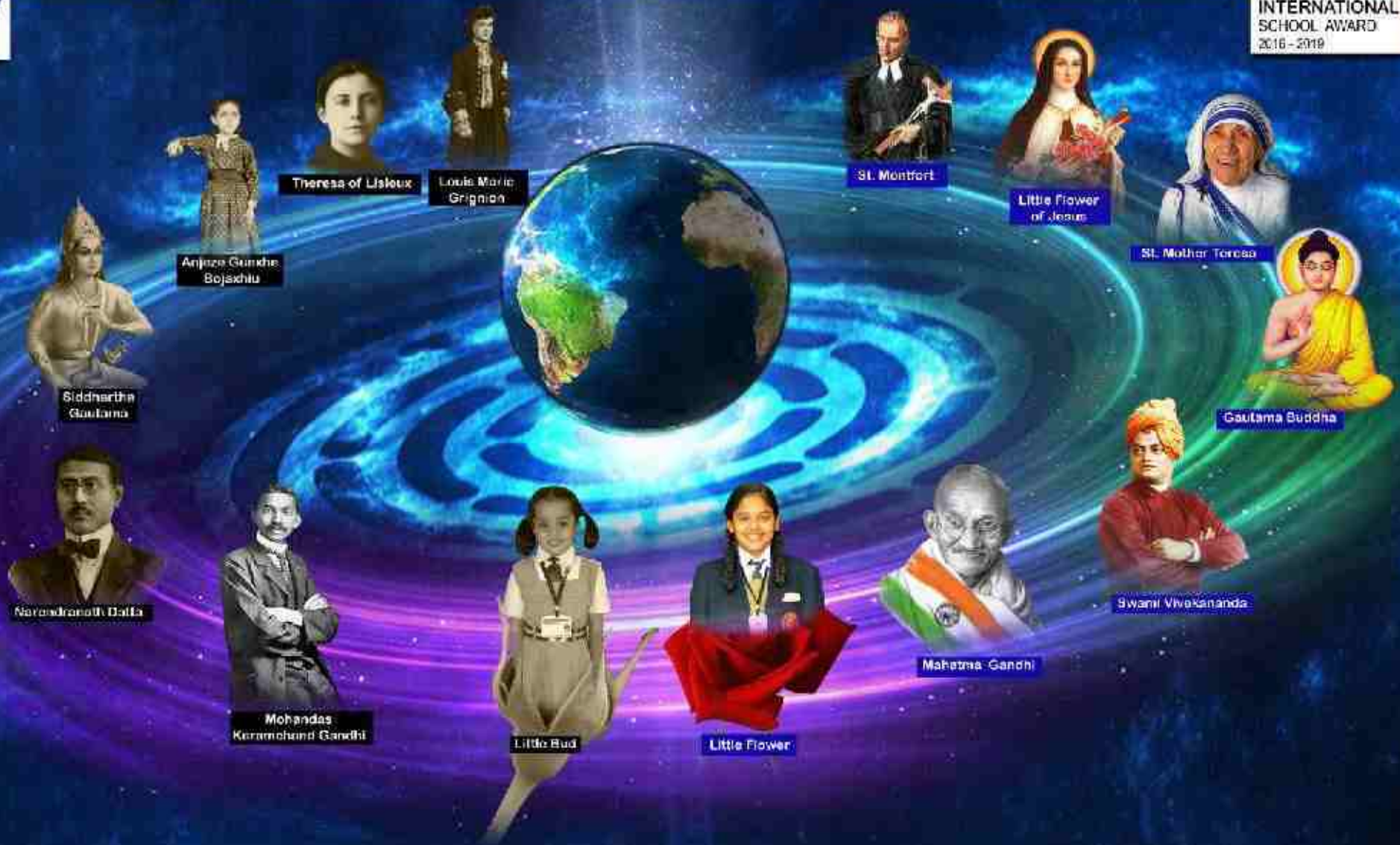

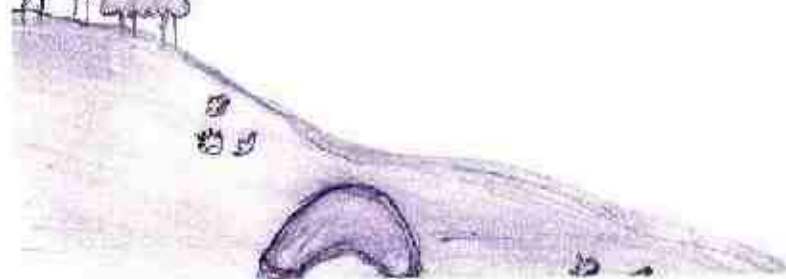

Go and earn a name, fame and money and come back to tell us your success stories.

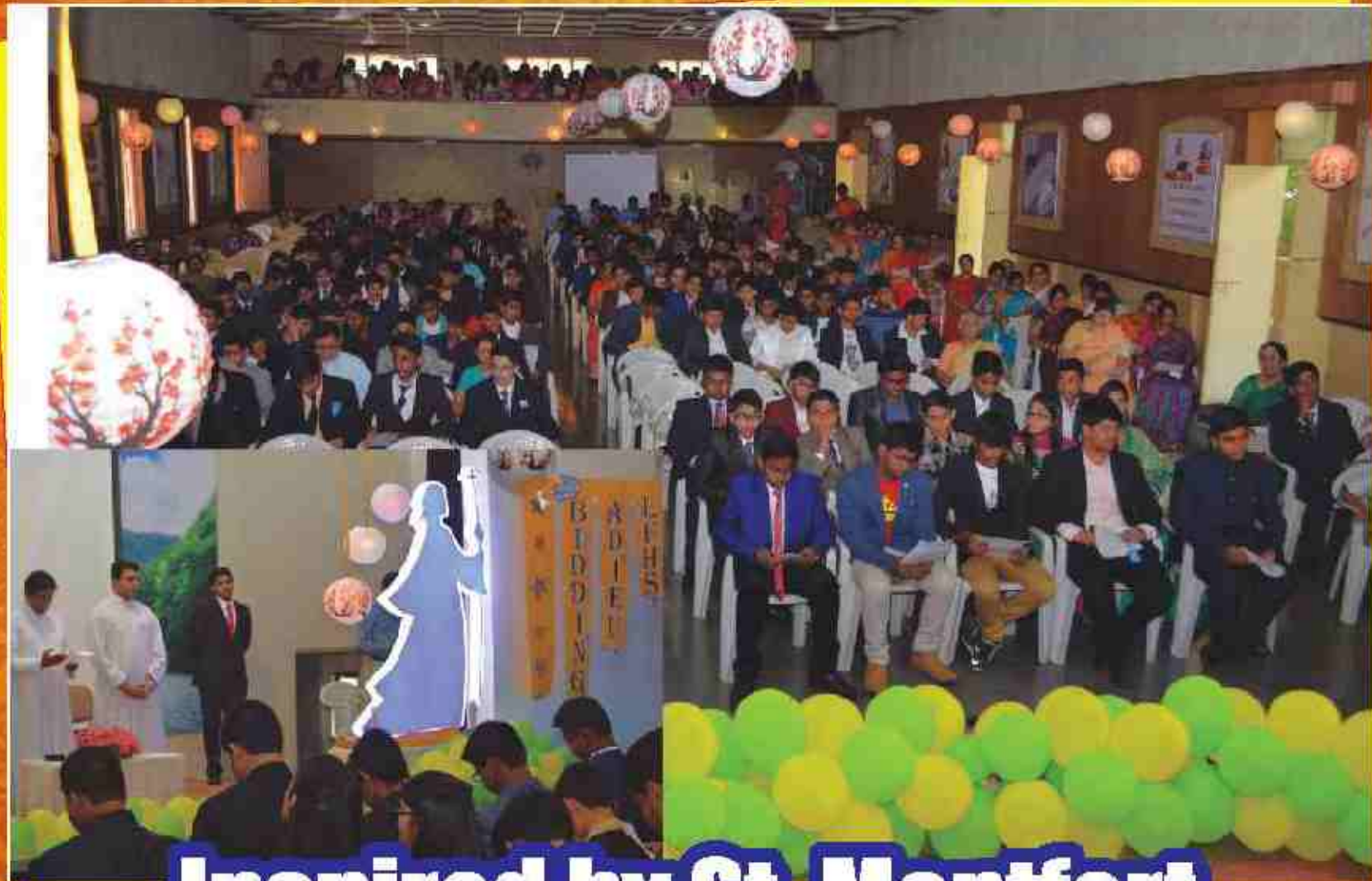
